

K Emu received the most points this week, modelling the PBL school rule of lining up safely and sensibly. Well done Kindergarten!



Our new Sports program began last Friday. The students of Horsley Park PS are fortunate to receive Basketball lessons from West Sydney Wolves! Of course, KE enjoyed every moment of the program and were on their usual, best behaviour. After the 30 minute Basketball session, our Sport lessons continued as we transitioned to School Sport, practising fundamental movement and cooperative game skills.

This term, we will be learning about how things move during Science lessons. A big focus with my Science program this term is STEM learning. Students will be involved in inquiry based learning each Thursday. They will be given outcomes to achieve and various resources to then Scientifically and Mathematically engineer solutions to problems and produce objects that should display a desired form of movement.

We will be talking in great deal and researching how we can look after special places around us for Geography lessons this term, with this learning continuing during Library lessons. Mrs Basak and I will both be addressing outcomes based on environmental conservation and protection.

During **Term 4,** Mrs Leearna Borg will continue to team teach with me each Thursday. During this time, the students will be taught about current technology, using up to date technology available to students in public schools.



Mathematically, our students are working hard on learning how to compare numbers using greater and less than, data collection, working with area and time concepts, fractions and patterning. Along with continuing whole number activities, addition & subtraction and multiplication and division! Number talks have been highly successful in K Emu. Students gain extra understanding of various number concepts by discussing word problems, abstract answers in which a question is needed, discussing visual patterns and generally - how to become quick thinking mathematicians!

I encourage all students to keep reading, writing and using their Rocket words in sentences at home. Once confident with their current list, don't forget to bring it in to class to be tested. The next level of words can then be taken home!



## Stage 3 - Canberra excursion- Parliament and Civics Education Rebate (PACER):

Stage 3 students from 5/6 Albatross, recently undertook an educational tour of the national capital — Canberra. Students were given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy. The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education.

For HPPS students, the day-trip wonderfully complimented our HSIE (History) unit of work – Australia *as a nation*, taught during Terms 2 & 3. Students visited: Parliament house, Old Parliament House, The Museum of Australian Democracy, The Australian War Memorial and Questacon.

To assist our families in meeting the cost of the excursion, the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$20 per student, under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate (PACER) program, towards those costs. The rebate will be paid directly to our school.

It was an exceptionally long (16-hours!), yet immensely rewarding day for all and sundry. I would like to congratulate all the attendees for their wonderful behaviour and unwavering enthusiasm, throughout the day.


