NAPLAN 2018

Commencing on Tuesday 15th May, the students in Years 3 & 5 will be completing the NAPLAN tests over three days. These tests provide a snapshot of student performance and progress in the areas of Literacy and Numeracy. Unfortunately, this time can be stressful for students in these grades due to undue pressure placed on them by parents and the media. In order for students to successfully complete this process and achieve their best results, follow these simple rules:

- **1.** Ensure that your child is in bed at a reasonable time. (A well-rested student is a happy and productive student!)
- **2.** Ensure that your child eats breakfast each morning (being hungry can greatly affect a student's ability to concentrate)
- Reassure you child that you just want them to TRY THEIR BEST. (Student's need to know that their best is good enough!)

Dear Parents / Caregivers,

Welcome to Term 2! I hope you enjoyed the break and are feeling suitably refreshed for what looks set to be an extremely busy term ahead. During week 5 of Term 1, our seniors partook in an overnight camp at Wooglemai EEC (Enviornmental Education Centre) at Oakdale – the purpose of which, was to prepare them for their role as Peer Support leaders during this term. The program will commence in week 3, and will run for half an hour on Friday afternoons, until week 9. This year, our focus is on *Anti-Bullying*. Our senior students will lead and mentor the younger stduents at HPPS through a variety of challenging and enjoyable activities.
