Multi-age classes at HPPS 2020


Multi age classes are made up of students drawn from different year levels. Our school has formed multiage classes this year. The formation of classes is a rigorous process and at Horsley Park Public School our teaching staff have worked collaboratively to place students carefully.

There are many competing priorities that are taken into consideration when the school forms classes, however, please be assured that the classes are made by placing student needs at the centre of all decisions made. They are increasingly common in schools particularly in smaller schools with lower enrolment numbers like ours. Many schools adopt this practice. The NSW Department of Education recognises that mixing students of different ages can be academically and socially advantageous. Many parents are concerned when their child is placed in a multi-age class. Research shows there is no difference in academic achievement between children in multi-age classes versus straight classes. Students in multi-age classes are less competitive with one another and more cooperative than students in same-grade classrooms. Children different learn at paces. Multi-age classes offer a wider range of curricula and students take greater responsibility for their learning. Younger children gain selfconfidence and maturity by being exposed to older students; older students learn to be positive, peer leaders and role models for the younger students. Students develop friendships across grade levels and multi age classrooms instil a greater sense of responsibility for one another, and a better sense of community.

At Horsley Park Ps we pride ourselves on ensuring every child's learning and social emotional needs are met. Rest assured this will continue to be our school's commitment.
